Welcome to our first bulletin of the school year. We have changed to a monthly bumper version this year to cram in everything that is going on both inside and outside of school.



#### **Time Team**








#### It's all Latin to me!

#### The library lives again!









#### **Space explorers**



#### Year 7 Sleuths - Part 1


Year 7 in English enjoyed playing detective while studying Sherlock Holmes! Each team had to use the picture clues to solve the case!






#### Year 7 Sleuths - Part 2

#### **Soccer stars**


It was fantastic to see so many attendees for the first football training session of the year. Some amazing skills and fair play were on show and we see even more pupils turn up in the upcoming weeks.






#### Year 6 Number crunchers - Part 1


Year 6 have been exploring lots of different ways a number can be made. They've used partwhole models, bar models, dienes and place value counters to name a few.






#### Year 6 Number crunchers - Part 2

"I love that we can learn different subjects in Bellingham Middle School, for example cooking."


