

Dear Parents/Carers.

I hope you've all had a great week! As part of the government's Step 3 roadmap, the guidance around wearing face coverings in education has changed. From Monday 17 May, face coverings are no longer required to be worn by pupils in classrooms or communal areas, or by staff in classrooms. Face coverings should however still be worn by pupils in Year 7 and above when travelling on school transport. This guidance may change in future in response to any localised outbreaks, including variants of concern. We will keep you up-to-date. The full, updated government guidance can be accessed here.
