Pupils have been taking part in all sorts of various activities this week, all geared towards promoting an awareness of safety when going online.




Here are Y5, guessing the appropriate age for various social media sites. They were quite shocked at the results!

Important messages we are sharing and promoting...



Zip it

Keep your personal stuff private and think about what you say and do online.



Block it

Block people who send nasty messages and don't open unknown links and attachments.



Flag it

Flag it with someone you trust if anything upsets you or if someone asks to meet you offline.



Talk it

Limit your screen time and talk to adults about what you do online.



Guide it

Have control of your digital footprint. Check parental controls and antivirus software on devices and routers.



Have role models that use the internet positively. The internet is an amazing tool if used correctly and safely.
