
The Carol Service at St Cuthbert's was wonderful with great singing taking place and excellent community support. Our readers were fantastic and read with great clarity.


Staff return to school on Monday 8th January for a training day and we look forward to welcoming all pupils back into school on Tuesday 9th January.








### **Burning up**

Year 6 had a great time joining some of the primary school children earlier this month for some Christmas maths.






#### **Scatter brains!**
