

Sharing Images - Years 7 and 8

Northumbria Police's Prevention Through Education Team visited our school on Tuesday 23rd April to deliver sessions to students in years 7 and 8 on the risks and consequences associated with the sharing of inappropriate images via text message and social media.

The purpose of the session is to equip children with the knowledge and skills to protect themselves, and to make them aware of how these images can be used to exploit young people. The session covers:

- * what is an inappropriate image?
- * why young people send inappropriate images
- * consequences
- * the law
- * where to find help and support when images have been shared
