

Dear Parents/Carers,



1st week of Advent



We have got into the spirit of Advent, with our own version of the Advent wreath, which has been placed in our foyer.

Advent and particularly the four Sundays before Christmas Day have been a period of preparation for Christmas for many centuries.

To celebrate the season, Christians join in the tradition of the Advent wreath. A traditional Advent wreath contains four candles, spaced around the body of an evergreen wreath. Three of the candles are purple, and the fourth is pink

Each of the four candles represents one of the four Sundays before Christmas. The lighting of the candles is, therefore, a form of countdown to Christmas.

A fifth candle is optional and can be placed in the centre hole; its preferred colour is white. The first candle, which is purple, symbolizes hope.
